Rights come with Huge Responsibility!

The rights and responsibilities you have today come from a number of different sources. They can come through Acts of Parliament and laws made by judges, and some from the South African law. Together they form the South African Constitution.

The right to peaceful protest is a vital part of democracy, and it has a long, distinguished history in South Africa although of late, some of the incidents lacked responsibility and turned ugly. A peaceful protest is just that, peaceful. No injury or damage to property is supposed to happen, not to mention loss of life!

Mixed visions and infiltration normally cause some protests to turn ugly and protesters need to have a way to vet protestors because at the end of the day, the protest, with the necessary responsibility, will remain focused on the grievance and getting it resolved instead of bringing in other new unnecessary issues of transgression!

Anyone who is in South Africa for any reason has fundamental human rights which the government and public authorities are legally obliged to respect. These became law as part of the

Chapter two 'Bill of Rights' of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, Act 108 of 1996.

The Bill of Rights
The Bill of Rights gives further legal effect to the fundamental rights and freedoms on your rights as a Human. These rights not only impact matters of life and death, they also affect the rights you have in your everyday life: what you can say and do, your beliefs, your right to a fair trial and other similar basic entitlements.

Most rights have limits to ensure that they do not unfairly damage other people's rights. You have the responsibility to respect other people's rights, and they must respect yours.

Your human rights are:
the right to life
freedom from torture and degrading treatment
freedom from slavery and forced labour
the right to liberty
the right to a fair trial
the right not to be punished for something that wasn't a crime when you did it
the right to respect for private and family life
freedom of thought, conscience and religion, and freedom to express your beliefs
freedom of expression
freedom of assembly and

association
the right to marry and to start a family
the right not to be discriminated against in respect of these rights and freedoms
the right to peaceful enjoyment of your property
the right to an education
the right to participate in free elections
the right not to be subjected to the death penalty
If any of these rights and freedoms are breached, you have a right to an effective solution in law, even if the breach was by someone in authority, such as, for example, a police officer.

If you are in a situation in which you believe that your human rights are being violated, it's advisable to see if the problem can be resolved without going to court by using mediation or an internal complaints body. Where you believe your rights have not been respected and you cannot resolve the problem outside court, you are entitled to bring a case before the appropriate court or tribunal in SA. The court or tribunal will then consider your case.
